ASSOCIATION FOR BEHAVIOUR ANALYSIS AUSTRALIA LIMITED (ABN 24 165 099 392) (**we, us** or **our**), understands that protecting your personal information is important. This Privacy Policy sets out our commitment to protecting the privacy of personal information provided to us, or otherwise collected by us when providing our platform to connect members and professionals, and events (**Services**) or when otherwise interacting with you.

THE INFORMATION WE COLLECT

- 1. **Personal information**: is information or an opinion, whether true or not and whether recorded in a material form or not, about an individual who is identified or reasonably identifiable.
- 2. The types of personal information we may collect about you include:
 - 2.1. **Identity Data** including first name, middle name, last name, title, date of birth, gender, job title, photographic identification and images of you.
 - 2.2. **Contact Data** including billing address, office address, email address and telephone numbers.
 - 2.3. **Financial Data** including bank account and payment card details (through our third party payment processor, Stripe).
 - 2.4. **Background Verification Data** including your passport number, driver licence number, photographic identification, proof of qualifications or other details requested as part of our verification process to comply with our due diligence obligations, anti-money laundering laws and related ongoing monitoring commitments.
 - 2.5. **Transaction Data** including details about payments to you from us and from you to us and other details of products and services you have purchased from us or we have purchased from you.
 - 2.6. **Technical and Usage Data** including internet protocol (IP) address, your login data, your browser session and geo-location data, device and network information, statistics on page views and sessions, acquisition sources, search queries and/or browsing behaviour, information about your access and use of our website, including through the use of Internet cookies, your communications with our website, the type of browser you are using, the type of operating system you are using and the domain name of your Internet service provider.



- 2.7. **Profile Data** including your username and password for our platform, profile picture, purchases you have made with us, support requests you have made, content you post, send receive and share through our platform, information you have shared with our social media platforms, your interests, preferences, feedback and survey responses.
- 2.8. Interaction Data including information you provide to us when you participate in any interactive features of our Services, including surveys, contests, promotions, activities or events.
- 2.9. Marketing and Communications Data including your preferences in receiving marketing from us and our third parties and your communication preferences.
- 2.10. **Professional data** including where you are a worker of ours or applying for a role with us, your professional history such as your previous positions and professional experience.
- 2.11. Sensitive information is a sub-set of personal information that is given a higher level of protection. Sensitive information means information relating to your racial or ethnic origin, political opinions, religion, trade union or other professional associations or memberships, philosophical beliefs, sexual orientation or practices, criminal records, health information or biometric information. In the course of providing our Services, we may collect, or come across such sensitive information in different situations, including during the course of conducting a background verification check on you, when reviewing your CV, and where we ask for your dietary requirements if we are arranging catering for you, including at an event. The types of sensitive information we collect include:
 - 2.11.1. professional associations or memberships;
 - 2.11.2. health information; and
 - 2.11.3. criminal records.

How we collect personal information

We collect personal information in a variety of ways, including:

- 1. **Directly:** We collect personal information which you directly provide to us, including when you register for a membership, through the 'contact us' form on our website, in-person at events or when you request our assistance via email, or over the telephone.
- 2. **Indirectly:** We may collect personal information which you indirectly provide to us while interacting with us, such as when you use our website, in emails, over the telephone, in-person and in your online enquiries.



- 3. **From third parties:** We collect personal information from third parties, such as details of your use of our website from our analytics and cookie providers and marketing providers. See the "Cookies" section below for more detail on the use of cookies.
- 4. **From publicly available sources:** We collect personal data from publicly available resources such as the Australian Securities and Investment Commission (ASIC) and professional networking sites such as LinkedIn.

Why we collect, hold, use and disclose personal information

We have set out below, in a table format, a description of the purposes for which we plan to collect, hold, use and disclose your personal information.

 Sensitive information: We only collect, hold, use and disclose sensitive information for the following purposes: any purposes you consent to; the primary purpose for which it is collected, to determine your meal preference at events, to assess whether to accept you as a member and to register you as a member; secondary purposes that are directly related to the primary purpose for which it was collected, including disclosure to the below listed third parties as reasonably necessary to provide our Services to you; to contact emergency services, or to speak with your family, partner or support person where we reasonably believe there is a serious risk to the life, health or safety of you or another person and it is impracticable for us to obtain your consent; and 	Sensitive Information



- if otherwise required or authorised by law.

OUR DISCLOSURES OF PERSONAL INFORMATION TO THIRD PARTIES

- 1. We may disclose personal information to:
 - 1.1. our employees, contractors and/or related entities;
 - 1.2. IT service providers, data storage, web-hosting and server providers;
 - 1.3. marketing or advertising providers;
 - 1.4. professional advisors, bankers, auditors, our insurers and insurance brokers;
 - 1.5. payment systems operators such as Stripe;
 - 1.6. our existing or potential agents or business partners;
 - 1.7. anyone to whom our business or assets (or any part of them) are, or may (in good faith) be, transferred;
 - 1.8. courts, tribunals and regulatory authorities, in the event you fail to pay for goods or services we have provided to you;
 - 1.9. courts, tribunals, regulatory authorities and law enforcement officers, as required or authorised by law, in connection with any actual or prospective legal proceedings, or in order to establish, exercise or defend our legal rights; and
 - 1.10. any other third parties as required or permitted by law, such as where we receive a subpoena.

OVERSEAS DISCLOSURE

 While we store personal information in Australia, where we disclose your personal information to the third parties listed above, these third parties may store, transfer or access personal information outside of Australia, including but not limited to, Canada. We will only disclose your personal information overseas in accordance with the Australian Privacy Principles.

YOUR RIGHTS AND CONTROLLING YOUR PERSONAL INFORMATION

- 1. Your choice: Please read this Privacy Policy carefully. If you provide personal information to us, you understand we will collect, hold, use and disclose your personal information in accordance with this Privacy Policy. You do not have to provide personal information to us, however, if you do not, it may affect our ability to provide our Services to you and your use of our Services.
- 2. Information from third parties: If we receive personal information about you from a third party, we will protect it as set out in this Privacy Policy. If you are a third party providing personal information about somebody else, you represent and warrant that you have such person's consent to provide the personal information to us.



- **3. Anonymity:** Where practicable we will give you the option of not identifying yourself or using a pseudonym in your dealings with us.
- 4. **Restrict and unsubscribe:** To object to processing for direct marketing/unsubscribe from our email database or opt-out of communications (including marketing communications), please contact us using the details below or opt-out using the opt-out facilities provided in the communication.
- 5. Access: You may request access to the personal information that we hold about you. An administrative fee may be payable for the provision of such information. Please note, in some situations, we may be legally permitted to withhold access to your personal information. If we cannot provide access to your information, we will advise you as soon as reasonably possible and provide you with the reasons for our refusal and any mechanism available to complain about the refusal. If we can provide access to your information in another form that still meets your needs, then we will take reasonable steps to give you such access.
- 6. Correction: If you believe that any information we hold about you is inaccurate, out of date, incomplete, irrelevant or misleading, please contact us using the details below. We will take reasonable steps to promptly correct any information found to be inaccurate, out of date, incomplete, irrelevant or misleading. Please note, in some situations, we may be legally permitted to not correct your personal information. If we cannot correct your information, we will advise you as soon as reasonably possible and provide you with the reasons for our refusal and any mechanism available to complain about the refusal.
- 7. **Complaints**: If you wish to make a complaint, please contact us using the details below and provide us with full details of the complaint. We will promptly investigate your complaint and respond to you, in writing, setting out the outcome of our investigation and the steps we will take in response to your complaint.

STORAGE AND SECURITY

- 1. We are committed to ensuring that the personal information we collect is secure. In order to prevent unauthorised access or disclosure, we have put in place suitable physical, electronic and managerial procedures, to safeguard and secure personal information and protect it from misuse, interference, loss and unauthorised access, modification and disclosure.
- 2. While we are committed to security, we cannot guarantee the security of any information that is transmitted to or by us over the Internet. The transmission and exchange of information is carried out at your own risk.

COOKIES

1. We may use cookies on our website from time to time. Cookies are text files placed in your computer's browser to store your preferences. Cookies, by themselves, do not tell us your email address or other personally identifiable information. However, they do recognise you when you return to our online website and allow us to pre-fill



forms. If and when you choose to provide our online website with personal information, this information may be linked to the data stored in the cookie.

 You can block cookies by activating the setting on your browser that allows you to refuse the setting of all or some cookies. However, if you use your browser settings to block all cookies (including essential cookies) you may not be able to access all or parts of our website.

LINKS TO OTHER WEBSITES

 Our website may contain links to other party's websites. We do not have any control over those websites and we are not responsible for the protection and privacy of any personal information which you provide whilst visiting those websites. Those websites are not governed by this Privacy Policy.
