



HOW TO REPRESENT YOUR ABA AUSTRALIA CERTIFICATION

Congratulations on your membership with Australia's only self-regulatory body for behaviour analysts!

Membership with ABA Australia is a prestigious achievement which:

- Increases employers, carers, and consumers' confidence in your knowledge skills, and abilities as a behaviour analyst.
- Recognises that you have the best qualifications based on national standards to give expert advice on behaviour change.
- Communicates that you will abide by the ABA Australia Code of Ethical Practice which demonstrates your commitment to safe, ethical, and evidence-based service delivery.

To ensure that you are recognised under this professional banner, it is important that you represent your certification correctly.

LISTING YOUR CERTIFICATION

Certified Behaviour Analysts can use the title 'Certified Behaviour Analyst' or the post-nominal 'CBA' after your name.

Certified Behaviour Analysts-Undergraduate can use the title 'Certified Behaviour Analyst-Undergraduate' or the post-nominal 'CBAU' after your name.

Professional Members can use the title 'Professional Member of ABA Australia'.

Affiliate Members can use the title 'Affiliate Member of ABA Australia'.

Student Members can use the title 'Student Member of ABA Australia'.

Supporter Members can use the title 'Supporter Member of ABA Australia'.

OTHER GUIDELINES

- If you are an applicant for a membership, do not represent yourself with any title relating to ABA Australia.
- If you have a medical exemption or other reason for temporary leave from the association, do not represent yourself as having an active membership.
- ABA Australia provides certifications not licences, so you should only represent yourself as having a certification not a license.
- Examples of how to list your certification:
 - CBA: Kate Smith CBA
 - CBAU: Kate Smith CBAU
 - Professional, Affiliate, Student, and Supporter: Kate Smith Professional Member of ABA Australia or Kate Smith Student Member of ABA Australia
